### Platinum Pass remains free through FY24

Successful transit pilot program has been extended through June 30, 2024

The Department of Administration has extended the fully subsidized Platinum Pass transit card program in Maricopa County through June 30, 2024. Launched a year

ago in response to a decade-long decrease in transit ridership worsened by the pandemic, the pilot program was intended to assess how much cost affected state employees' willingness to use mass transit for their work commutes. ADOA originally authorized fully subsidizing the Capitol Rideshare program for six months, which was later extended and due to expire June 30, 2023. However, a 26 percent increase in transit ridership



during the pilot program convinced ADOA leaders the fully subsidized program was adding value so they extended the full subsidy for another full year, until June 30, 2024.

#### How to sign up for the Platinum Pass and plan trips

Employees with an active Platinum Pass (expiration date September 30, 2024) may continue using their current transit cards—there is no need to apply for a new one. Other employees wishing to participate in the program should visit the <u>Capitol Rideshare</u> website to learn details and download the application. Completed applications should be returned to your agency's human resources contact for processing (Capitol Rideshare staff are not authorized to process Platinum Pass applications). Please allow two weeks to receive your transit card, which will be mailed to your home address of record in YES. (Note, you may want to login to YES and verify your address is correct and current.)

# Carpool parking permits renewals underway; all carpoolers must have their parking permits renewed by June 30

Capitol Rideshare issues carpool parking permits to employees who carpool at least three times per week. Cur-

rent permits expire June 30, 2023. Capitol Rideshare staff sent renewal stickers to all agency travel reduction coordinators where state employees are currently participating in the carpool program.

The renewal process is being managed through Commuter Club powered by Ride-Amigos. Employees enrolled in Commuter Club who have a registered carpool permit number will receive renewal stickers from their agencies' travel reduction coordinators. If you do not have a valid record in RideAmigos, you will not be included on the renewal list. If you no longer need your permit, please return the permit via interoffice delivery to Capitol Rideshare, ADOA-HRD, 100 N. 15<sup>th</sup> Ave., #301, Phoenix, AZ 85007.

### Help fight transit fraud

Employees who lose their Platinum Pass must notify their human resources department, in writing, that the pass is lost or has been stolen. The Platinum Pass may be used only by the employee to whom it was issued.

#### **Steps to prevent fraud:**

- If you do not receive your Platinum Pass within three weeks of your agency processing the application, please call Capitol Rideshare.
- Always keep your Platinum Pass secured.
- NEVER loan your pass to anyone else.
- Report your pass missing immediately (in writing) by contacting your human resources liaison.
- Follow up with HR to ensure your missing pass has been replaced (Capitol Rideshare staff can check this as well).

## **Emergency Ride Home: peace of mind for Commuter Club members**

Employees who use an alternate mode at least twice per week—carpool, transit, telework, compressed work week, electric vehicle, biking or walking—are eligible for free membership in Commuter Club. The primary benefit of Commuter Club is to offer employees who use alternate modes of transportation a free emergency ride home (ERH), up to twice per fiscal year, for unexpected emergencies. For more information regarding the Emergency Ride Home Program, be sure visit the Commuter Club page online.

Please note: you must have a Lyft account to self-dispatch the emergency ride home. Capitol Rideshare provides a Lyft Pass code to pay for up to \$50 for an emergency ride (this will not cover a driver tip). Capitol Rideshare cannot reimburse employees for an emergency ride home; you must download the Lyft Pass credit via your Commuter Club dashboard and apply it to your Lyft account prior to booking the ride. Please ensure you are enrolled in the Commuter Club, you have an active Lyft account in good standing and you follow the instructions for downloading and using your Lyft Pass credit. Members of <u>Commuter Club</u> are eligible to join the fun and start redeeming their points for the chance to win a gift card! Here's how it works:

- 1. Log your alternate modes and collect your points.
- 2. Once you have at least 100 points, scroll to the bottom of your dashboard to your My Rewards section. Click on RideAmigos Sign Up and Trip Logging Points.
- 3. Under your points total, click on Show Details and Inventory.
- 4. The dashboard expands to show you the awards available to you and the points required to enter the drawing.
- 5. Click on the drawing you wish to enter. If you have the points available, you can redeem points for up to three entries. Example: If you have a points balance of 300 and each entry is 100 points, you can redeem the balance of your points for three drawing entries.

### **Coordinator's Corner**

## Save the date: Post-survey coordinator debrief takes place July 26

Staff has scheduled a post-survey coordinator debrief for July 26, 2023. The 45-minute session will begin at 9:30 a.m. Like last year, we will hold the debrief session at the Arizona's Connected Workforce large conference room and offer a Google Meets link for participants who wish to join via teleconference. The debrief will include a review of the survey process, high-level results and a discussion of the annual travel reduction plan. This will allow coordinators to share what worked well for them and what did not and how to improve the process. After the debrief, we will offer a tour of the Arizona's Connected Workplace hoteling facilities for anyone who is interested. Please watch for additional information regarding this event. Staff will begin preparing the agency travel reduction surveys and post them to the Capitol Rideshare website in June. Coordinators should review their agency's report cards prior to the debrief.

## Please do not cancel transit cards when employees transfer agencies

For employees who use the Platinum Pass should take their Platinum Passes with them when they transfer agencies. Please do not cancel a Platinum Pass if the employees are transferring to another state agency unless an employee requests it. The transit passes will transfer with them to their new agencies. If the employee's pass is canceled and he/she must apply for a new pass, it will take 2—3 weeks for the employee's new Platinum Pass to arrive to their home address. ### **Reminders & Notes**

#### Vanpool: commute option for shift work

Vanpool may be an option for a larger group of employees (6-15) that live at least 15 miles away from work. Capitol Rideshare will pay a monthly subsidy to cover the lease cost for each eligible state employee who participates in a qualifying vanpool; employees pay their share of the fuel costs. Valley Metro, through a contract with Enterprise, furnishes vans to registered commuter groups. Capitol Rideshare's vanpool page offers additional details about participating in the vanpool program and Valley Metro's video details vanpool logistics. Please note: this is not a door-to-door shuttle service nor a temporary solution for employees who suddenly find themselves without transportation. Employees must form or join a vanpool; Capitol Rideshare cannot assign employees to a vanpool.

## Electric vehicle charging stations and carpool parking permits available to employees

State employees who drive electric vehicles have options for charging these vehicles during the work day. ChargePoint has multiple charging stations at (or near) many state worksites. Charge-Point's website features an interactive map detailing where charging stations are located and the associated costs. Drivers set up an account with ChargePoint; users can order a card or download an app onto their smartphones, which will allow them to plug in and use the charging stations. User fees vary by location. The fees at the Capitol Mall stations are \$1.50/hour for the first three hours and \$5.00/hour after. Employees driving zero-emission vehicles at least three times a week are eligible for Commuter Club membership and carpool parking permits.

Capitol Rideshare is administered by the Arizona Department of Administration Human Resources Division; it is funded by the Federal Highway Administration through the Maricopa Association of Governments and by the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality.
