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## Valley Metro is celebrating Rideshare Month

Contest grand prize is a stay at the Hilton Phoenix Resort at the Peak!

To raise awareness about commuting alternatives versus driving alone, Valley Metro is celebrating Rideshare Month in October with a variety of contest prizes, including gift cards and a four-pack of tickets to the Arizona State Fair. This year's grand prize is a complimentary night's stay at the Hilton Phoenix Resort at the Peak!

To participate in the fun, track your alternative mode trips at <u>ShareTheRide.com</u> to enter contests to win prizes throughout the month. Alternative modes include:

- Transit: state employees receive a 100 percent subsidy on the <u>Platinum Pass</u>, the fare card used on Valley Metro buses and light rail.
- Carpooling: state employees who carpool three or more days a week can apply for a <u>Rideshare parking permit</u>, allowing them to park in reserved Rideshare parking (where available).
- Vanpooling: employees who participate in a <u>qualifying vanpool</u> will receive a monthly subsidy toward the cost of the vanpool.
- Electric Vehicle: employees who drive <u>electric vehicles</u> can apply for a Rideshare parking permit (some locations have ChargePoint EV charging stations (EVCS); employees must have a ChargePoint account to use the EVCS).
- Bike/walk: Take a look at <u>resources</u> for employees who incorporate biking or walking into their commutes.
- Remote work: Remote work is a management option that allows qualified state
  employees to work from home, or a state office location closer to home, one or

### Already using an alt mode? Join Capitol Rideshare's Commuter Club

There is no cost to join the <u>Commuter Club</u>; membership is open to State of Arizona employees in Maricopa County (non-university) who use an alternate mode at least twice a week. Benefits include an emergency ride home from work via Lyft Pass credit (up to \$50) twice each fiscal year for qualifying emergencies (restrictions apply). ### Arizona's Connected Workspace provides office and meeting facilities for remote workers who need occasional state workspace

With thousands of state employees working remotely, the state closed or vacated leases on several office buildings, consolidating workspace and reducing the state's real estate footprint by more than one million square feet. To support remote workers who occasionally meet at or work from a state facility, the Arizona Department of Administration (ADOA) opened Arizona's Connected Workspace, a state-of-the-art hoteling facility for use by all state employees, in 2022. Located at 1400 West Washington Street in Phoenix, the workspace is designed for the modern workforce with a variety of conference rooms, individual work cubicles, collaborative huddle spaces, and a large training room. The space also features a café-style minimart and kitchen area.

To ensure employees are able to most effectively use the space and equipment, the facility is managed by a full-time administrator, Shelley Witt. In this role, Shelley solves user-related issues, facilitates tours, and assists employees in making reservations. She has also witnessed a tremendous increase in the facility's use since it opened more than a year ago. "The first month, we saw just under 200 reservations and most recently we have scaled to reach over 800 reservations in one month. Employees have responded excitedly to the opportunity to host meetings, work independently, and collaborate with their coworkers here," said Shelley.

In addition to the attractive design and support from a full-time administrator, Shelley notes that the flexibility and variety of the workspaces make the hoteling space ideal for remote workers. "Some might want to use an individual workspace that mimics a desk in a working office, while others may require more privacy, opting for a room that allows them to be in virtual meetings and on their phones most of the day. State agencies often take advantage of the eight modern conference spaces, collaboration rooms, and the large training room for their team members," Shelley said.

### How to sign up for the FREE Platinum Pass transit card

Capitol Rideshare is fully subsidizing the Platinum Pass, meaning state employees can take transit for FREE through June 30, 2024. To sign up for the Platinum Pass program, please visit the <u>Capitol Rideshare website</u> to learn more about the program and download the application (applications should be returned to the employee's human resources contact for processing; Capitol Rideshare staff cannot process Platinum Pass applications). Please allow 2-3 weeks to receive the card, which is mailed to the employee's home address.

Members of <u>Commuter Club</u> are eligible to join the fun and start redeeming their points for the chance to win a gift card! Here's how it works:

- 1. Log your alternate modes and collect your points.
- 2. Once you have at least 100 points, scroll to the bottom of your dashboard to your My Rewards section. Click on RideAmigos Sign Up and Trip Logging Points.
- 3. Under your points total, click on Show Details and Inventory.
- 4. The dashboard expands to show you the awards available to you and the points required to enter the drawing.
- 5. Click on the drawing you wish to enter. If you have the points available, you can redeem points for up to three entries. Example: If you have a point balance of 300 and each entry is 100 points, you can redeem the balance of your points for three drawing entries.

## Staff has begun sending out Capitol Rideshare 2024 calendars

Staff has begun reaching out to coordinators to send the Capitol Rideshare 2024 calendars. For smaller boards and commissions, staff sent enough calendars for all employees at your agencies. For larger agencies, staff will email a list of your agency's employees who are enrolled in Commuter Club—those employees should receive a calendar. Please distribute the remaining calendars in your new hire packets. Also, please be sure to let us know if any of the employees on your list have left your agency so we can update the database with the most current information.

# Please cancel transit cards when an employee leaves state service

Agencies must cancel an employee's transit card when an employee is leaving state service. Transit cards are considered state property and must be returned at separation. Capitol Rideshare staff are reviewing data at the beginning of each month and finding active transit cards for inactive employees. Staff then emails the list of these active cards to the Platinum Pass processor for the agency with a request to cancel the card. If your agency has received such a list and request, please work with the processor (if it is someone other than you) to review the agency's procedures to determine how this is happening and change the process to ensure former employees are not leaving with active transit cards. Please do not cancel the transit card if the employee is transferring to another state agency. ## Emergency Ride Home: don't wait for an emergency—join Commuter Club today!

The primary benefit of Commuter Club is to offer employees who use alternate modes of transportation an emergency ride home (ERH), up to twice per fiscal year, for unexpected emergencies. Examples of qualifying emergencies include medical emergency, family medical emergency or the commuter's carpool driver unexpectedly leaving early. ERH will return the employee to their car or their home. Please note: you must have a Lyft account to self-dispatch the ERH; Capitol Rideshare provides a voucher credit to pay for up to \$50 for an emergency ride. Please do not wait until you are experiencing an emergency to sign up for the program. Visit the Commuter Club page for more information.

#### Valley Metro service changes start Oct. 23

Valley Metro announces changes to transit service in April and October each year. The transit agency has posted changes effective October 23, which include increases on local bus routes and the elimination of west valley neighborhood circulator routes.
