

2024 Travel Reduction Survey results

More than half of agencies, boards and commissions met the statutory goal

Each year, all major employers in Maricopa County must survey their employees regarding their work-related commutes. More than 18,000 state employees who work in Maricopa County participated in the 2024 annual Travel Reduction Survey. Data shows that more than half of state agencies, boards and commissions met or exceeded the statutory goals of no

more than 60 percent single occupancy vehicle (SOV) trips and SOV miles traveled (SOVMT) among employees' commutes to work. This year, the overall SOV rate for the state is 46 percent, and the SOVMT rate is 42 percent. This is the fourth straight year that the state's overall SOV and SOVMT rates were below the mandated 60 percent rate. Capitol Rideshare staff attribute these positive outcomes to the continued widespread adoption of remote work among state employees since 2020. **Individual Agency Results**

State employees are finalists in Clean Air Campaign Awards

Each year, Valley Metro sponsors the annual Clean Air Campaign Awards to recognize individuals and organizations that demonstrate a commitment to reducing air pollution by using an alternate mode of commuting to work, such as carpooling, taking transit (bus or light rail), vanpooling, teleworking, biking or walking. This year, the state has four finalists for the Clean Air Campaign Awards; these state employees' dedication to alternative commuting methods has made a significant impact on our environment. Winners will be announced at the awards ceremony and lunch that will take place on Oct. 30, 2024. This year's finalists are: Angelica Burris - Carpool Finalist: Angelica Burris, a business analyst with the Arizona Supreme Court, carpools three days a week with her husband, covering over 50 miles round trip. She also teleworks two days a week. Angelica has logged more than 21,000 carpool miles, saving over \$7,500 in commuting costs. She champions the benefits of carpooling, from dedicated parking spots to the chance to win prizes such as gift cards. "Having a carpool partner relieves commute fatigue and enhances the overall experience," she notes. Miranda Riojas – Transit Finalist: With over two decades of transit rides, Miranda Riojas has been using local buses and express buses since 2001. Currently, she commutes 15 miles each way to her job at the Arizona Department of Economic Security. Miranda encourages others to try taking the bus at least once a week. Michelle Salazar - Transit Finalist: Since 2017, Michelle Salazar has been a dedicated transit user, commuting 50 miles round trip from the East Valley to the Department of Water Resources five days a week. Logging over 35,000 transit miles, Michelle has saved more than \$6,000, thanks to her fully subsidized transit card. She praises the modern features of the new express buses, emphasizing their comfort and convenience. James Tiffany – Transit Finalist: James Tiffany, a licensing surveyor supervisor at the Arizona Department of Health Services, has embraced transit for 17 years. Currently commuting 45 miles round trip four days a week, James has logged over 45,000 alternative mode miles, with more than 40,000 attributed to transit. He appreciates being able to read or catch up on emails during his commute.

Members of <u>Commuter Club</u> are eligible to join the fun and start redeeming their points for the chance to win a gift card! Here's how it works:

- 1. Log your alternate modes and collect your points.
- 2. Once you have at least 100 points, scroll to the bottom of your dashboard to your My Rewards section. Click on RideAmigos Sign Up and Trip Logging Points.
- 3. Under your points total, click on Show Details and Inventory.
- 4. The dashboard expands to show you the awards available to you and the points required to enter the drawing.
- 5. Click on the drawing you wish to enter. If you have the points available, you can redeem points for up to three entries. Example: If you have a point balance of 300 and each entry is 100 points, you can redeem the balance of your points for three drawing entries.

Agency survey reports and travel reduction plans; debrief in December

Staff has posted individual agency survey reports (for agencies with more than 10 employees) to Capitol Rideshare's <u>Travel Reduction Survey</u> webpage. Please review your agency's report, as this details the success of the Travel Reduction Program efforts at your agency. Agencies that did not meet the mandated SOV rate will need to complete an agency travel reduction program (TRP) plan if their current plan has expired. Staff will reach out directly to the agencies that will need to submit a new plan (the plan is effective for two years). Staff will host a virtual debrief session from 9:00–9:45 a.m. on December 10; please hold the date. Staff will send an invitation and detailed information via email in November.

Arizona's Connected Workspace: State employees may reserve workspace or meeting rooms

Remote workers who occasionally need to meet at or work from a state facility may reserve space at the Arizona's Connected Workspace, a state-ofthe-art hoteling facility. Located at 1400 West Washington Street in Phoenix, the workspace has a variety of conference rooms, individual work cubicles, collaborative huddle spaces, and a large training room. FREE Platinum card for transit

Capitol Rideshare is fully subsidizing the Platinum card for transit program through June 30, 2025, meaning transit is FREE for participating state employees. Emergency Ride Home program is a perk of Commuter Club membership

The primary benefit of Commuter Club is to offer employees who use alternate modes of transportation an emergency ride home (ERH), up to twice per fiscal year, for unexpected emergencies. Examples of qualifying emergencies include a medical emergency, family medical emergency or the commuter's carpool driver unexpectedly leaving early. ERH will return the employee to their car or their home. Please note: You must have a Lyft account to self-dispatch the ERH; Capitol Rideshare provides a voucher credit to pay for up to \$50 for an emergency ride. Ride-matching for carpool and vanpool

Employees who are seeking a carpool partner or an open seat in an established vanpool should create a profile on the <u>Capitol Rideshare Ride-</u> <u>Amigos</u> platform as well as the Valley Metro <u>ShareTheRide.com platform</u>. This will allow employees to seek and reach out to rideshare partners whose routes and schedules match their own.

Capitol Rideshare is administered by the Arizona Department of Administration Human Resources Division; it is funded by the Federal Highway Administration through the Maricopa Association of Governments and by the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality.
